As a nurse here at the hospice, I see the impact of your support every single day. I see how, thanks to you, we're able to provide tailored, specialist care and support to patients and their loved ones.

You may have heard on the news that hospices are going through a really tough time right now. In fact Hospice UK has reported a national £77m funding shortfall across the sector. This deficit is hitting hospices hard – so much so that many are needing to cut services.

"At Rowcroft we're determined to keep our services running, despite these challenging times.

Here at the hospice, we need £10 million annually to deliver our care. Only 24% of this comes from the NHS, so we rely heavily on the incredible generosity of our local community. Your participation – whether through donations, gifts in Wills, supporting our shops and cafés, regular giving, playing our lottery, volunteering or offering other support – makes all the difference.

With our general donations dropping and costs rising, we've launched a 'Sponsor a Nurse' campaign – and we're hoping for your support to keep our nurses caring for our community. Thanks to your kindness, we will continue to ensure that people's last days are the best that they can be.

Caring for our rural communities


At Rowcroft, our care stretches across 300 square miles of South Devon, touching every corner including the most rural and remote areas. Our teams travel far and wide along narrow country lanes and across diverse landscapes including rugged moorland, lush valleys and farmland, to provide exceptional care to everyone who needs it.

One such rural community that we cover is Ashburton, where talented musician and painter Jake Jacobs lived with his wife, Eliza, and their for Jake in his final weeks in our Inpatient Unit.

"Jake was diagnosed with an inoperable brain tumour and his condition deteriorated rapidly," says Eliza. "I couldn't cope looking after a three-year-old, a teenager and my very sick husband. Rowcroft came to the rescue, offering Jake a place to be properly cared for. The loving care and support we received was heaven sent.

"To be able to sit in the lovely gardens looking out over the sea meant so much to us, and the way I was included in his care was incredibly precious. Everyone should have the opportunity to benefit from this type

Getting the conversation started

Rowcroft's Education Team has been busy spreading the word about the importance of planning for the future. Through a range of pop-up events, including in Ella's Café Lounges, they've been encouraging people to chat over coffee and cake about future and endof-life planning. supporting someone with a learning disability, supporting young people and children, making a Will, organ donation and preparing a funeral.

Lavender Square and dementia care

With 14,000 people in Devon living with dementia, and with this figure expected to double in the next 30 years, there is an urgent need for local, specialist dementia care. Rowcroft is seeking private funding



to build a pioneering 60-bed specialist nursing home, Lavender Square.

The nursing home will not only care for those living with dementia and other complex needs, but will bring a valuable and sustainable income source to the hospice.

To address the shortage of local nurses, Rowcroft has successfully recruited nurses from overseas. We're thrilled to welcome Monigue Shephard and Zun Kay Khaing who have joined our Inpatient Unit as our first international recruits, from New Zealand and Singapore respectively.

Following the passing of former Torquay United football star Paul Holmes who died at the hospice in May after a diagnosis of bowel cancer, his family has been busy fundraising for Rowcroft so that other local patients and their loved ones can experience our vital care and support.

Paul had received specialist and tailored care at home from Rowcroft's Community Team, before entering Rowcroft's Inpatient Unit.

"I don't know what we'd have done if Rowcroft wasn't here," said Paul's wife Kate. "The care was tailored to all of our needs. They had time to reassure, to alleviate fears, to explain, and they created a bond with us straight away."

Kayleigh Hines was one of Rowcroft's team who supported Paul in the Inpatient Unit.

"Paul's aim was to raise as much money as possible to say thank you and give back to this wonderful and much-needed charity who gave him, me and our family so much love, care and support," says Kate. "He intended to do some fundraising challenges himself but sadly time ran out... so donations in his memory will certainly be a way to help him achieve this 'goal'!"

"It was a privilege to care for Paul," says Kayleigh. "Our highly skilled multidisciplinary team was able to provide a range of specialist support that helped Paul and his loved ones through the end of his life, recognising what is important in the context of a family structure."

Paul's memorable football career included two four-year stints at Torquay United between 1988–1992 and 1999–2003 where he played as attacking right-back. He also made 306 more appearances for Doncaster Rovers, Birmingham City, Everton in the Premiership and West Bromwich Albion

At the time of going to print, the family had raised over £5,000 for the hospice, including £1,000 that was gifted from Everton Football Club to contribute towards the costs of the funeral but the family donated it to

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Shining a light in Sue's memory

In 2023, just after celebrating her 61st birthday on holiday with her husband Peter, Sue Bradshaw received a devastating diagnosis: an inoperable and untreatable tumour. Peter shares how the exceptional support they received both at home and at the hospice, along with the care he received after Sue's passing, made a profound difference in their lives.




"We were put in touch with Rowcroft and assigned Vernon, a Clinical Nurse Specialist, who visited us at home. He helped with the early discussions and looked after Sue's medication, but he didn't come and just check her meds, it was much more holistic. We had long, thoughtful conversations and he was tremendously supportive. Vernon and the Hospice at Home team also made things much easier by dovetailing with other local support services.

"As well as receiving support from the Hospice at Home team, Sue spent time at the hospice after being admitted with an infection. The staff on the wards were amazing; you get this sense of a really strong team of people working together. They're so caring and nothing's a problem. It's a lovely
