TO FUNDING CHALLENGES UPLIFTING CARE AT ROWCROFT HOSPICE

Welcome

Welcome to the spring/summer edition of Hospice Matters magazine, proudly sharing news and stories from Rowcroft Hospice.

I'm sure you've seen in the press that the past year has brought huge financial challenges for UK hospices. Following the Budget announcement in the autumn, Rowcroft is facing an additional £225,000 in annual costs, due to increased National Insurance contributions and rises in the national living wage. While we support salary increases for our dedicated staff, the escalating costs place a strain on us as a charity, making it harder to deliver our vital, compassionate care that our families deserve.

We warmly welcomed the government's announcement in December of additional funding for hospices in England. However, it still remains unclear how much of this funding will reach Rowcroft, or if it will be enough to cover the financial impact of the recent Budget changes.

The generosity of our community people like you - has never been more critical, enabling us to support three



out of every four of our patients. Regular donations in particular make a powerful difference, enabling us to plan ahead and directly support our teams to continue delivering exceptional care to local families.

"Thank you for being there. Together, we will ensure that patients and their loved ones receive the dignified care they deserve.

Sons of football legend Paul Holmes share story of loss

Supporting bereaved loved ones with their mental health is key as they navigate their journeys through loss and grief. Ben and Jake, 22-year-old twins from Newton Abbot, talk about the loss of their dad, Paul Holmes, and the support the family received from the hospice.



"Losing Dad is the worst thing that's ever happened to us," says Ben. "Men often struggle to confront their grief, but I've

realised that half the battle is talking about it. Hiding your feelings is the worst thing you can do."

Paul, a celebrated local football legend known for his time with Torquay United, passed away last year at the hospice following a diagnosis of bowel cancer. The twins are full of praise for the specialist care Paul received from Rowcroft. Initially supported at home by the hospice's Community Team, Paul later spent his final weeks in Rowcroft's Inpatient Unit.

"There's no price you can put on the care we received," said Jake. "Rowcroft didn't just care for Dad; they cared for us as a family. They made us feel at ease and supported us through every step. We don't know what we would have done without them."

Rowcroft's ambassadors inspire change

An innovative project at Pendennis Care Home in Paignton, led by one of Rowcroft's ambassadors, Dominic Sojin Pinhero, is a shining example of the incredible ripple effect of Rowcroft's education work. Developed as part of Rowcroft's end-of-life care ambassadors programme, Dominic's project is transforming the lives of residents living with dementia, enabling them to relive cherished memories by visiting places from the comfort of their armchairs through a virtual reality style headset. Dominic's work illustrates how the hospice's ambassadors, supported by Rowcroft's Education Team, are making a tangible difference far beyond the hospice walls.

Planting the seeds of inclusive dementia care



In collaboration with the EMPOWER dementia network, Rowcroft recently hosted a creative workshop led by Rowcroft nurse Anna Cawrse and Dr Gill Horne, Programme Director -Care Services. Local participants with experience of dementia shared ideas on shaping inclusive, high-quality care using a garden metaphor - creating

'pollinators' for positive and beneficial things, 'tools' to assist, and a 'compost heap' for unhelpful practices. Their insights will inform a UK-wide manifesto, helping to make dementia care more inclusive and equitable for all.

This work aligns with Rowcroft's efforts to contribute to the dementia agenda for Devon. On 25 March 2025, the hospice is hosting its second Dementia and Palliative Care Conference, highlighting the vital role of palliative care in enhancing the lives of those living with dementia.



Gareth Wynn was cared for by the hospice before he passed away in Rowcroft's Inpatient Unit in February 2024, aged 39. Here, Gareth's sisters share the story of his journey and the difference Rowcroft made during his final weeks.





Gareth was deeply committed to his family and was known throughout Torbay as a local radio station executive and DJ. Following a cancer diagnosis, and with his health fast-declining, Gareth saw his life expectancy rapidly shorten from years to months to days – all within just a few weeks. This was a heartbreaking reality that was incredibly difficult for his family and friends to come to terms with, but Rowcroft's care helped to make those final days easier to navigate.

Gareth's sister, Nicola, remembers the immediate comfort that Rowcroft's staff provided when he arrived at the hospice:

"It was such a difference from day one when he arrived. His journey hadn't been the most comfortable and after a quick conversation, a haircut, a shave and a change of clothes, Gareth was back. My brother was back.

"The staff helped us too, because we wouldn't have got through without them. They helped us to help him and nurse him, and we were able to stay overnight – and that was really important to us.

"Late into the night when he died, we were listening to music and he was surrounded by us and the staff, who had such an empathetic way of explaining what was happening and why."

Lauren, Gareth's twin sister, added: "Rowcroft had a real sense of home, rather than a hospital feel. He had music on in the background which helped him relax. I can't tell you enough, how the hospice experience was absolutely second to none.

"Since Gareth passed, we support Rowcroft through fundraising and events because we want other families to experience the same peace and care that Rowcroft gave to us."

Nickie describes her volunteering as deeply rewarding, saying, "When I work with patients and family members, I hold a space for them and I listen. Sometimes the conversation is just a general chat about anything at all – their lives, families, memories – and other times it's about what is bothering them or making them anxious; the interactions vary."

Nickie also leads the Threshold Choir in South Devon, a group of female singers who sing for people on the threshold of life and death. Their gentle songs bring peace and comfort to patients and families at the hospice, as well as at various Rowcroft events, such as Meadow of Memories and Light Up a Life.

For one patient, Robert, a retired chartered surveyor, his wish was to climb to the roof at the top of the hospice – partly for the spectacular views of the sea, but mostly to admire the stunning architectural features of the historical building up close.

Rowcroft's Physiotherapy Technician Bev Tonks and Occupational Therapist Debby Hill carefully planned the climb, supporting Robert to navigate two flights of steps, including a very steep, narrow staircase near the top.

"It took huge effort on Robert's part," says Bev. "We ensured he had plenty of rest stops along the way and we monitored him closely to make sure he was safe."

"It was quite emotional for Robert and his wife Amanda when they got to the

top, and it was a privilege to be part of such a significant moment with them," shared Debby.

"Robert was so chuffed to complete the climb, and the views were terrific," remembers Amanda. "The building absolutely fascinated him and he spent time looking at all the architectural features, including the old water tanks. He had always been passionate about historical buildings and he particularly loved 'behind the scenes' tours at National Trust properties.

"Now that he's passed, it's a lovely memory to reflect on. I always felt that the Rowcroft team did their very best to accommodate Robert's individual needs, and that made their care so special."


