# Heart failure project

Did you know that more than half a million people in the UK are living with heart failure? National studies have shown that patients with this condition are less likely to be referred to a hospice, even though they could really benefit from the personalised care hospices can provide to help improve their quality of life.

Last year we were thrilled to be awarded funding to help develop specialist care for patients with end stage heart failure, to help make end of life care more accessible to these patients. We have been working in partnership with both the Heart Failure and Palliative Care teams at Torbay Hospital and we are pleased to share that so far this year referrals to Rowcroft have doubled. This marks a really positive step in supporting patients with these complex needs in our community and helping them make the most of every moment with their loved ones

# Celebrating success at the Care Awards



June was a time to celebrate as we achieved the community support award at the Outstanding Care Awards for Devon and Cornwall and Dr George Walker, Consultant

in Palliative Medicine received the bronze award for end of life care excellence. This is such an honour for the hospice and we are incredibly proud of the hard work of all of our clinical teams.

# The fundraising scoop

## Equipment appeal thank you

We would like to say a huge thank you to evervone who contributed to our equipment appeal. The incredible efforts of our community raised over £24.000. Among the amazing fundraising efforts, the Newton Abbot Hospital League of Friends donated a wonderful £10,000. The generosity shown in the appeal has

helped fund vital equipment needed to provide comfort to our patients and their families. With your help, we exceeded our target of £11.000, which now means we are able to ring-fence money to purchase equipment over the next couple of months as part of our Inpatient Unit Rolling Replacement Programme. Thank you!

#### An event-full year in 2018

It's been another action-packed year of events here at Rowcroft. In March our events kicked off with more than 70 people taking on the 150 foot crane and going 'Over the Edge'. May saw the Colour Rush, Devon's brightest 5k, return to Teignmouth and more than 800 people enjoyed a multi-coloured run/walk.



In July almost 1,400 women walked either five or ten miles along Torbay's beautiful coast as part of the 2018 Sleepwalk. It was another amazing event which has raised more than £120.000 so far, which will be such a huge help to us in caring for more than 2,000 people each year.

Later that month we opened up much of the 22-acre grounds of the hospice for the Garden Party. Seven hundred mums, dads, children and grandparents enjoyed live music, entertainment and craft stalls and raised a fantastic £6.000. Thank you to all who joined us.

As we go to print with this issue of Hospice Matters, hundreds of you are getting ready to put power to the pedals for Ride for Rowcroft. Whether you are getting together for a family Sunday cycle, or you are taking on the challenge of the Haytor Hillclimb, thank you for supporting your local hospice.

# Remembering loved ones at Christmas

For some of us, our experiences of grief can feel even more poignant during the festive season. Irrespective of when the loss of a loved one occurred, their absence may be felt stronger at Christmas because of memories and family traditions.

At Rowcroft, our team of Social Workers help to create personal ways for families and loved ones to capture treasured moments for reflection and comfort. Community Social Worker Emily Madsen explains some of the special ways Rowcroft provides this support through specialised memory work.

"Through the support of memory work we help patients and families to go beyond what is currently happening around them in the physical sense and focus on valuing relationships, personal history and family. Children, in particular, can benefit from individualised memory objects/messages that offer an ongoing relationship with the person who has died. Memory boxes, love cards, letters, journals, life stories and video recordings are just some of the ways that we support people to capture the memory of

their loved one to continue to cherish



"Love cards are simple and incredibly personal to a child and their loved one. The cards provide prompts for family members to complete together capturing special messages like: You are special because...; I feel so proud when...; I love you because...; You shine when



"A memory box might include photos, some favourite music, letters or a recorded message. These special objects and messages can help remind a child or loved ones of happy times they spent together and offer some comfort and continue



bonds after a loved one has died. They help to remind people about a favourite day at the beach, a funny jumper they wore at Christmas and most of all. the love that they shared and will continue to share. Nobody completely dies as long as they are remembered "

# Out of the shadows and into the light

Winter can be a difficult time for some of us – long dark nights, inclement weather and the expectations of the festive season can be really challenging even without the addition of loss and grief in the mix.



Bereavement is a feeling which most people experience at some time in their lives and each person reacts to it in different ways. For some people experiencing the loss of a loved one. Christmas can be a particularly challenging time. Rowcroft offers a Bereavement Support Service to care for the emotional needs of a relative at such a critical time. Lynne Kenderdine has been a bereavement volunteer for two years now and explains why she chooses to donate her time to this service:

"A deep heartfelt desire to help other people through their grief process is what motivated me to become a Bereavement Volunteer. This might be one of the darkest times of their lives and I wanted to help make a difference to people.

"Having lost people close to me, I know how devastating loss can be. Grief and loss are very underrated and hidden emotions in our society, yet they are entirely natural and normal feelings. When our feelings of loss are repressed or not acknowledged, they can have devastating impacts on our health and wellbeing. You can't prevent

someone's suffering, but the action of 'being there', providing one-to-one support and a listening, sympathetic ear can be enormously healing."

Last year Rowcroft's Bereavement service provided support for 144 members of our community. John Balment received bereavement support following the death of his beloved wife: "I owe so much to Rowcroft Hospice and its Outpatient Bereavement Support Service, without whom and the help of an exceptional friend, whom I call my guardian angel, I don't know where I would be today. The care the hospice gave my wife, both in respite and during her final days was exceptional. Little did I know that two and a half vears later I would suffer a reaction to losing my lovely wife which literally knocked me for six. But with the untiring help of a Bereavement Counsellor at Rowcroft and my friend. I came through a very dark period escaping out of a tunnel and into the davlight. Rowcroft is an amazing place and, like its bereavement support service, must never be allowed to fade away."

# Winter wellness

"As winter approaches and the nights begin to draw in, sometimes we feel like hibernating. We can make all sorts of excuses for giving up on social activities, exercising or taking a walk outside. This can really affect our mood and sense of wellbeing.

"We need to look after ourselves on many levels including our mind, body and spirit. It is good to find an activity that is enjoyable and makes us smile. Although it may be extremely tempting to stay warm and cosy indoors, just getting outside among nature or breathing in the fresh air can have a really positive impact on our overall wellbeing.


