

## Our charity shops rely on the generosity of the local community, so we always welcome donations of good quality saleable items, especially:

- ✓ Ladies, men's and children's clothing and accessories
- ✓ Bric-a-brac (glassware, pottery, jewellery, silverware, ornaments, pictures, etc.)
- ✓ Books (for adults and children)
- ✓ Household items (soft furnishings, kitchenware, etc.)
- ✓ Toys and games
- ✓ CDs, DVDs
- ✓ Electrical items in working order
- ✓ White goods in working order

### If you're donating upholstered furniture, it'll need:

- A fire safety certificate - this should be attached somewhere, usually under the cushions on a sofa, on the underside of a dining chair seat or sewn into the seam on a mattress
- No tears or stains

### You might be surprised to hear we accept:

- ✓ Video players (but sorry we don't accept videos)
- ✓ Mattresses (as long as it meets our upholstered furniture requirements as stated above)

## Sorry, we can't take:

- X** Triple wardrobes or similar sized wall units and cabinets over 5ft
- X** Desks over 5ft
- X** Old fashioned (non flat-screen) TV's
- X** Printers, computers, laptops and mobile equipment
- X** Gym equipment
- X** Electric beds
- X** Gas cookers or any other items which run on gas (fireplaces etc.)
- X** Pianos and large organs (but we do accept keyboards as long as they're in good working condition)
- X** Duvets, pillows, blankets and cot mattresses (unless new in sealed bags)
- X** Items that need to be built once collected (unless brand new in box)
- X** Baby car seats
- X** Helmets or safety hats
- X** Knives
- X** Music stack systems (small radios and CD players are accepted)
- X** Any items which are broken or unusable (as we will have to pay to dispose of them)

**Please note: Items which are not in good working order will cost us to dispose of, so please bear this in mind when considering whether to donate an item.**
